

# **Iowa Statewide Education Survey Findings**

lowa voters overwhelmingly support education freedom and giving families more flexibility to tailor an education for each child. They approve of the state's ESA program and demand a new tax credit program to further support families. Three-quarters of voters agree—lawmakers need to keep pushing education freedom in lowa forward.

## OVERWHELMING SUPPORT FOR EDUCATION FREEDOM

Voters across lowa support giving families the flexibility to choose the best school for their children.


- 75% support education freedom, including more than half (53%) who *strongly* support it.
- 73% want lawmakers to keep pushing lowa forward on education freedom and leading by example, only 7% want lawmakers to stop progress.
- 73% would support a program in the state that would give families more choices and control over how they can educate their children and save taxpayers money.

## SUPPORT FOR A NEW TAX CREDIT PROGRAM

Voters support new ways for parents to educate their children.

- 64% support the state offering K-12 families a \$4,000 tax credit they can use to educate a child.
- 74% of K-12 parents are personally interested in participating in this program with their children; nearly half (48%) are *very* interested.

#### **EDUCATION FREEDOM IS A WINNING MESSAGE**

Voters support the program because it gives families more flexibility to personalize education, while saving money.

- A new program providing K-12 families a tax credit would provide greater access to high-quality educational options. (54% said this statement makes them more favorable toward a new tax credit)
- A tax credit would provide families with more education freedom while limiting government overreach. (53%)
- lowa spends about \$17,000 in taxpayer money every year to educate each child at a public school. By giving families a \$4,000 tax credit to help pay for approved education expenses, we can better educate our children while also saving taxpayers the remaining \$13,000. (50%)

# POSITIVE IMPACT FOR SUPPORTERS OF A NEW EDUCATION TAX CREDIT

Voters will reward a candidate who supports a new tax credit for families.


- 48% *nearly half of voters statewide* would be more likely to vote for a candidate for governor if that candidate supported an education tax credit.
- Audiences most likely to vote for a candidate for governor: MAGA Republicans (72%), 2024 Trump voters (69%), conservatives (69%), Republicans (69%), K-12 parents (60%)—dads (67%) and moms (54%), 4<sup>th</sup> Congressional District (59%), Sioux Falls/Sioux City/Omaha DMAs (55%), rural (54%), HHI less than \$50,000 (53%), less than college education (53%), men (53%), 35-44 year olds (53%), 55-64 year olds (52%), HHI \$50,000-\$100,000 (52%).


#### APPROVAL OF IOWA'S EDUCATION SAVINGS ACCOUNT PROGRAM

Voters view the state's ESA favorably.

• 56% hold a favorable opinion of Iowa's ESA program, more than twice as many as those who hold an unfavorable opinion (24%).

"As you may know, lowa has an education savings account program that lets K-12 families use funding for state-approved educational expenses like tuition, tutoring, and advanced coursework for their children.
